# Seasons Greetings

December Club Meeting / Christmas Party... When my girls heard that snow was in the forecast they asked if they could ride the sleds. I told them that the ground is still pretty wet and an inch or two of snow isn't enough to keep from tearing up the yard. They're still pretty excited that the season is almost here, and I hope they can wait until December 22 to ride the trails this year. By then hunting season will be over and with enough help from the membership, the trails will all be cleared, marked and ready to ride... snow permitting. There have been several changes made to the trail recently as a result of properties changing hands or requests by the landowners. Mike Waeghe's effort with a bulldozer and several truckloads of fill should result in a smoother ride. Fred Bradshaw and a landowner with some heavy equipment have relocated a bridge and plan to move another to aid in grooming. "Dan D" has been busy marking and is looking for help in doing some more trail clearing. Jim Vink is also rerouting some trail and will have an excavator on site soon. I've mentioned four Club members, but I know that there's been plenty more involved! There's still plenty to do and another reroute is in the works for the Whittier Road area.

Most of the trail work is coordinated by the Trail Bosses who are responsible for maintaining the trail and landowner communications. The Club is looking for trail bosses in three areas; 1) North Trail, Hilton area, formerly maintained by Jeff Forberg. 2) South Trail, the Scottsville area previously maintained by Dan Gurbacki (Dan has enough to do with Groomer Operations). 3) South Trail, the Mumford area, previously maintained by Rich Manley. All three sections of the trail are established and ready for an easy hand off. While I'm on the subject of trails, another very important component - Trail Funding! Tom Francis has been doing this for a while and would like to retire after this season. If you are available to help with any of these positions within the Club, please contact any Board Member.

# The Tip of the Iceberg

As you know, most of an iceberg is below the surface. In fact, only about 11% of a floating iceberg is visible above the surface.

So why is this information in a Snowmobile club newsletter?

It is because a Snowmobile club that has in excess of 100 miles of trails is very similar to an iceberg in that what is visible is only a (small) part of the overall substance. Our trails are the visible aspect of what the club does. Behind the scenes (or below the surface) there is a tremendous amount of work being done.

Here are some examples of what I'm talking about.

You are probably aware that our Vice President, Tom Francis, takes care of the massive amount of paperwork and recordkeeping involved with the NYSSA funding of our trails. This takes a huge effort from Tom to gather work and groomer logs and compile it for submission. If there are any questions or if clarification is needed, Tom needs to contact those involved and get the facts straight. The State (NYSOPHP) requires that information regarding trail work, grooming and other trail related efforts, be reported in a specific way. If anything is not to the correct format, it's bounced back. All of this work is critical since it involves the major portion of the club income, to pay for maintaining trails and for grooming.

This reporting work is not all that is involved. A plan needs to be submitted prior to the start of the season, outlining any changes to be made and improvements that are to take place to the trail itself. All Trail Bosses submit a 3 page report to Tom so that he can compile an overall plan. If the plan is not approved, changes need to be made and then it's re-submitted.

Next we have the trail itself. Mike Waeghe, the Trails Coordinator and Jim Meyer as South Trail Boss, are in charge of our trails. This involves securing permissions from as many as one hundred Landowners and staying in touch with them. Also involved is organizing work parties to handle preparation and improvements. These work parties frequently involve machinery and materials. These also need to be coordinated. Some landowners want as few changes made to their land as possible. Others allow bridges to be constructed and culverts to be installed. The club needs to abide the wishes of the Landowners.

There are approximately 20 trail bosses who Sign their section of the trail and do prep and maintenance, including pre season brush clearing.

Marking of the trail is a crucial aspect of any snowmobile trail system. The "State" has specific guidelines to follow for uniformity and overall safety. Trail signing workshops are required for all trail bosses. These workshops are presented by volunteer instructors from NYSOPHP or by Mike and Jim. A big effort is made to have our whole trail marked correctly and uniformly. During the season, any signs that are knocked down or blown over need to be re-installed. Slight changes or resigning sometimes becomes necessary. All trail bosses regularly check their trail sections to be sure that all is ok.

Now to the groomers.

You know that we have 3 class A groomers. These are full sized diesel powered machines that will pull a full sized, 8'wide x 16' long "drag". There are 2 German built Pisten Bully's and one American built Tucker. The drags are all American made. Keeping these groomers in top shape and ready to work in the harshest conditions is a big job. Our Groomer coordinator, Dan Gurbacki believes in preventative maintenance. Any breakdown that happens out on the trail involves very cold and hard work as well as interrupting the grooming work that was being done. We do not want a groomer to be down during the season. Dan follows the manufacturer's checklists along with the common sense that he has practiced for years. Getting these machines ready to do their job is a lot of work. The groomer barn, new to us this season, is coming along very nicely. It provides a secure, dry, well lit environment to work on and store our equipment. We also store most of our other club equipment there. The club also owns 2 trail maintenance vehicles, 3 trailers and quite an assortment of tools. All of this requires maintenance and repairs. There have been bi-weekly Wednesday night work details for the past year. A small group of dedicated members have helped Dan to be sure that when the snow flies, we're ready.

Last but not least, we have members and officers doing important work in various ways. John Miller the Treasurer handles all the financial dealings and bill paying of the club.

Jim and Janet Howard are the Membership coordinators. They process most of the 1100+ memberships. Jim and Janet represent the club at area snowmobile events to try to increase the membership and promote the club. Jim is now the editor of the newsletter.

Rich Manley, our President, spends hours of his time dealing with important club and landowner/trail issues. Mark Kesselring is the club Safety Coordinator. Mark runs safety courses that help us live up to our club mission statement, "to promote safe and legal snowmobile use".

Eric Seith maintains the club attendance records.

Sean Mullen and Steve Forsini run the website. Steve updates the calendar and posts news and information. Peter D'Orazio has been the NYSSA Super raffle ticket coordinator for our club. Pete has also taken on the job of spearheading our French fry booth at the Hilton Applefest. This is the club's biggest fundraiser.

Bob Allen works with Mike Waeghe on the North trails and equipment and almost single-handedly grooms the north trails.

Robert Colby is a behind the scenes kind of guy. He gets involved with landowner issues and is also one of our valued landowners. Robert has been generous to the club with equipment and facilities use.

As I go on with this article, it is getting more difficult to bring it to a conclusion.

I did not set out to write a summary of who does what in the Hilton SnoFlyers.

There are many people not mentioned here. I feel that I've only revealed the Tip of the Iceberg.

I was trying to illustrate just some of the tremendous time and effort that is put into the club, so that its members can ride the trails. I am constantly amazed at the past efforts that have brought us this far and the current efforts that it takes to maintain it.

## How to Renew Your Club Membership Online

If you've received your snowmobile registration renewal from DMV and want to get your sled registered before Holiday expenses crop up, here is a reminder about how to obtain your 2010-11 NYSSA Membership Voucher.

- 1) Go to www.nysnowmobiler.com and click on the big green button. ---> This will take you to our secure Online Membership System.
- 2) Login with your six-digit NYSSA Member ID# and password. Your Member ID# is on your membership card, and also on your previous season's voucher. Hint: your password is made up of letters, and must contain at least one number. If you don't remember your NYSSA ID number, contact your Club's Membership Administrator at snoflyers@gmail.com. You may also email membership@nysnowmobiler.com or call the NYSSA Office, 888-624-3849 x103. **Reset password** can be used to obtain a new password, however users on AOL or Netscape may never receive the message, as these systems seem to think these messages are spam. If your email address recently changed, you may also never receive the message. Please call or email us for assistance.
- 3) Simply click on renew to renew your membership for the 2010-11 season. Follow the prompts on each screen, and when you are done you will see "Return Home to View Memberships and Print a Voucher" -- click on that, and that's right, you can print your voucher right on your own computer printer no waiting! Print an extra copy for your records.

**Groomers/Barns:** Dan out of town, but will be at the groomer barn Saturday morning to work on the doors, the big blue trailer with the decking, the compressor is wired and thank you for the wiring that was donated. There are possibly some doors available by donation from.

Trails: Mike: On the North Trail we have been quite busy. Dave Leverenz has lent us his bulldozer so we were able to widen the trail and fill two big water holes. The trail now goes farther to the west and the trail on the north end has had some extensive repairs. If you want to start early on your trails, check with your local land owner. Any signs that need to be ordered should be ordered through Mike at 202-6202. This will be posted on the website also. South Trail: we have some problems. Whittier Rd. land has been purchased by a landowner who does not want us to use his land. We do not have permission so far. The Salmon Creek Club has a friend who hunts with this landowner and may be able to set up a meeting with this individual. West of Widger Road there is an access that Robert Colby owns that we may have to look into at a further date. Dec. 19th is a set date for a big detail to put in that trail. Bob Allen put up a demonstration at East Ave and Ridge Road so that you can see what a properly marked trail looks like. Railroad tracks on Gallop need to be cleared. 8:00 on the morning at the railroad bed on Gallop Road you can meet them there. Dan is heading this up
