# January 2010 Membership Report - Jim Howard

I think most everyone knows that the Club has maintained a Microsoft Access Database on club membership since I have been your membership secretary. This year makes 5 years of record keeping and 6 in the club for me. When I first started this job I input the last 3 years that were available to me. That makes 9 years of records available.

The cool thing about Access is you can do all kinds of record searches comparing this and that. The program is cool enough to cause me to waste time looking for trends and statistics that really aren't important but to kill some time when it is 40 degrees out in the winter. If I actually had some training on it I might be dangerous but lucky for you I am self taught and have limited computer skills.

So what does it mean? Here are some statistics and numbers from the database. Currently the database contains 2275 unique entries. They are landowners, organizations and members. Address changes with members do not cause duplicate entries; just changes the address upon renewal. No info has ever been removed from the database, it just keeps growing.

- 09/10 current membership: 1132
- 08/09 membership: 1151
- New members this year that are not in the 9 year database: 236
- Members common to both recent years 805, that means that 327 members did not renew from last year. Surprisingly enough is that the statistics are similar to last year.
- Members with the last 4 consecutive years: 447 (First year of SRRA Bill)
- Members with the last 5 consecutive years: 198 (Rumor of SRRA)
- Members with 9 consecutive years: 30
- Numbers by zip code: 14468 (217) 14559 (158) 14428 (89) 14464 (71)
- Out of State members: 3

# HSF Survey Results Summary by Marty Sauer (Board Member)

As most members of this club are probably aware, we've recently completed a member survey to try to gain insight into the true thoughts and opinions of current and former club members. I, for one was curious about what would be the result of asking questions and opinions of people who seem to have pretty strong opinions about how things should be done. The survey was distributed as part of a mass mailing that went out to over 1100 snowmobilers. There was also an online version if some preferred this method. There were 135 responses, about 2/3 were from the mailed version. Not all respondents are current members. These are the results. I've tried to put mere numbers into some useful context. The numbers are facts; the comments are mostly my interpretation of what the numbers mean.

133 of the 135 Ride the club trails. (Not much of a surprise here). 72.6% do not come to club meetings. Most meetings have from 50 to 70 members. 74% say they are not involved in work details or other activities. Even with comparatively low participation in meetings and work details, 86% say they would become more involved if they had good reason.

To the question of "What is the main reason to belong to Hilton SnoFlyers?"; 34% say it's to support the club and the sport, 26.6% say that it's because of the trails. (I'm in the club whose trails I ride), 25% give what is thought to be the most popular reason, Registration fee reduction. It's great that 60+% say that it has to do with OUR club.

I asked for an overall 1-10 rating, 10 being highest. The overall average was 8.084. There was one rating of 2. There were 33 ratings of 10. Of those 33, 12 are active members and 21 don't come to meetings or work details. Apparently we are meeting the expectations of those people, active or inactive. Of the lowest ratings, there was one 2 and the rest 4s and 5s - total 11. Of those 11, only 3 say they would not be interested in getting more involved in the club.

"What aspects of the club need most improvement"? There were blank spaces on 32% of the responses. 15.5% said "not sure" or "no suggestions" 13.3% said "Good Job, I'm satisfied or none that I can see" Comments about Trails account for 10.3%. Grooming was next at 8.1%. The remaining comments vary from constructive to airing of grievances of various sorts. All Officers and Board members have a summary of each response and have specifically reviewed the "need improvement" comments.

"Would you participate in new activities" (Social and family oriented). 53.3% say yes. 14% said no or probably not.

"Have you met new friends through the club?" 54.4% Yes. 35.5% No. The best I can figure is that people meet on the trails or used to be involved in work details and meetings but answered no to the meeting and involvement questions.

Lastly, "Do you feel that you're well informed about the club and events?" 81.3% said yes. 12% said no. The reason given was lack of internet access. We're trying to figure out how to best communicate with that segment of our membership who doesn't use computers to find information about the club.

My conclusions to all this information are that the club Does satisfy the majority of its members and the general perception of the club management as to how things are going regarding member satisfaction is correct. In short, No Real Suprises. I have noted that there are 86 people who responded that while they don't attend work details or other events, they would be willing to. (If given good reason) This could almost double our pool of volunteers, allowing us to do better at our current projects or begin new ones. # **PROFESSIONAL SNOCROSS SET FOR RETURN TO FINGER LAKES**

Racing of a different breed to take over Farmington oval

FARMINGTON, N.Y. – Horsepower of a different breed will take over at Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack with the AMSOIL Championship Snocross Series Eastern Nationals returning to Western New York for the second consecutive winter. The two-day event, complete with amateur, semi-pro and professional racing, along with an aerial freestyle show is set for Friday and Saturday, February 5 and 6, 2010.

The Eastern Nationals mark the fifth stop of nine on the 2009-10 AMSOIL Championship Snocross Series (ACSS). Regional, Semi-Pro, and Professional level races, including finals for men and women are scheduled both days of the event, with Rock Maple Racing, a regional snowmobile circuit, competing for points in the national race.

"We're very excited to be able to bring professional snocross back to Western New York," said Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack president Chris Riegle. "Last year's event drew in over 13,000 spectators to witness some of the top names of snocross, and this year's event will be directly after the Winter X Games in Aspen. We look forward to seeing some the best in world compete once again."

Mens professional riders expected to appear include Tucker Hibbert, a four-time Winter X Games gold medalist; including the past three years (2007-2009). Winning his first gold medal at the age of 15, Hibbert currently holds the record for the youngest gold medalist in Winter X Games history and has enjoyed tremendous success on the ACSS circuit. Hibbert, who didn't compete in the Eastern Nationals last year at Finger Lakes is expected to be joined by defending AMSOIL Pro Stock champion and five-time Winter X Games medalist, Levi Lavallee. Also expected to compete are TJ Gulla, Robbie Malinowski, and Ross Martin.

Other than the anticipated appearance of Hibbert, changes from last year include condensing of the event into two days and having a large portion of the professional racing under the lights both days. Also new will be adjusted ticket pricing for kids 5-11, while children under 5 will be admitted free.

In addition to racing, fans can expect various snowmobile-related vendors, sled demonstrations, prize drawings and more. Friday evening will also be complemented by autograph sessions with many of the professional riders and a return of the aerial freestyle acrobatics of The Monster Energy Slednecks Invasion Tour. A fireworks show will close out the event on Saturday night.

Tickets are required for racing action which begins at 3 p.m. on Friday and 9 a.m. on Saturday. Advance tickets for adults (age 12 and up) are \$25 for a one-day pass, or \$40 for a weekend pass. Junior tickets (age 5-11) are \$15 for a one-day pass, or \$20 for a weekend pass. Also available are Family-Packs consisting of two adult and two junior weekend passes for \$99. All tickets are available for purchase at Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack, all Tops Markets, and Tickets.com. Tickets are also available on the days of the event for an additional \$5 for each adult ticket and an additional \$3 for all junior tickets. The gaming floor and thoroughbred racing simulcast viewing areas at Finger Lakes will remain open with no admission charge throughout the entire weekend.
