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### **Snowmobile Operator Age Requirements**

The most frequent question I am asked as a New York State Safe Snowmobiling Instructor is "Who needs to take a course?"

Of course, I recommend EVERYONE take a safe snowmobiling course. But, both you and I know that isn't going to happen, unless the legislature requires it by a law.

Here is the official language I just received from the NYS Office of Parks Recreation and Historic Preservation with my season package of information. At the end of the NYS language is a table prepared by me to help. I want everyone to know it isn't an official table from NYS.

Youth ages 14 through 17 years old may operate a snowmobile, on lands upon which snowmobiling is allowed, without adult or other supervision if they have successfully completed a snowmobile safety training course and received a Snowmobiling Safety Certificate recognized by the State of New York.

If youth ages 14 through 17 years have not completed the training course, they may operate a snowmobile if accompanied by (within 500 feet of) a person who is at least 18 years of age.

Youth ages 10 through 13 may operate a snowmobile, on lands upon which snowmobiling is allowed, if they have successfully completed a snowmobile safety training course, received a Snowmobile Safety Certificate recognized by the State of New York, and are accompanied by (within 500 feet of) a person who is at least 18 years of age.

Children less than 10 years old or less than age 14 without a safety certificate may operate a snowmobile only on lands owned or leased by their parent or guardian.

A non-resident operator who is a resident of another state or country and is the holder of a valid snowmobile safety certificate issued by that state or country shall be considered the same as the holder of a New York State Safety Certificate.

(Students taking the New York State Snowmobile Safety Course must be at least 10 years of age on the day the course ends.)

Here is a table that shows the age requirements for a NYS Safety Certificate:

Age 18 and above	No restrictions to operate a snowmobile due to age.
Ages 14, 15, 16 and 17	Legal to operate a snowmobile if supervised by an adult 18 years of age or older,
	or if they earn a NYS Safety Certificate.
Age 10, 11, 12 and 13	Not legal to operate a snowmobile unless they have both earned the NYS Safety
	Certificate AND are supervised by an adult 18 years of age or older.
Age 9 and younger	Not legal operate a snowmobile other than on parent's or guardian's land.

To be supervised is to have an adult 18 years of age or older within 500 feet of the youth operated snowmobile.
